Climate Metaphors

"Heat Trapping Blanket" - CO2 acts like a blanket that surrounds the Earth. More C02 in our atmosphere means a thicker blanket that traps more heat.

"Climate's Heart" - Just as a heart circulates blood and



regulates the body's temperature, the ocean controls the circulation of heat and moisture throughout the climate system.

Values Metaphors for Communities

"Protection" - We must protect people and places from



being harmed by the issues facing our environment.

"Responsible Management" - Taking practical,



common sense steps to address problems facing our environment today is in the best interest of future generations.

Framing for Your Community



"Solutions" - Concern for our climate is normal and action on climate is happening all around us. We can come together as community members to address climate change.

Embrace

Community action, responsibility, safety, the importance of oceans, we are problem solvers, and solutions in your community.

Avoid

(these can get you caught in a conversational "swamp")

Individualism, jobs vs environment, new study every week, my observation is as good as yours, climate = yearly weather patterns, CO2 is 'natural' therefore it is good, politics, nature works in cycles, picking up trash/recycling is the solution.

Helpful Phrases

"Oceans support humans" "Science is innovation" "Ecosystems are valuable resources" "We are connected to nature" "We are a community of problem solvers" "Our community came together and we're [local initiative]"
